## REHABILITATION OF COUNTY ROUTE 63

### OXBOW HILL RD AND MOON HILL RD



The Warren County Department of Public Works is in the design phase of a project to improve pavement conditions and make roadside safety improvements along County Route 63, Oxbow Hill Road and Moon Hill Road, in the Town of Queensbury. The project begins at the intersection of Oxbow Road and Route 149, and ends at the intersection of Moon Hill Road and Bay Road. The purpose of this project is to extend the service life of the roadway and provide motorists with improved safety and mobility by correcting pavement deficiencies and implementing various roadside safety improvements. All proposed work will be completed within the County's right-of-way.

This information flyer is being distributed to local residents to share information with the public on this important safety improvement project, and to request public comments during the design phase. A comment form is attached and can be mailed to the address listed, or comments can be sent to the email listed below.

#### **PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS:**

- ◆ Address deteriorated and cracked asphalt pavement and adjust roadway banking at curves with a combination of full pavement reconstruction, or milling off and replacement of the top asphalt course to provide an improved, smooth riding surface.
- ◆ Clean and upgrade existing drainage systems to efficiently collect stormwater runoff. Re-grade existing roadside drainage ditches.
- ◆ Install stormwater management features to address water quality requirements.
- ◆ Install new guide rail where warranted and repair damaged guide rail.
- ◆ Upgrade existing signs to meet current standards and install new signs where warranted.
- ◆ Alternating one-way traffic and short-term local detours will be used to route traffic around construction activities.

#### **ANTICIPATED SCHEDULE AND COSTS:**

- ◆ Design of the project will be completed by December 2020
- ◆ Construction is anticipated to begin in the Spring of 2021 and be completed in late Summer 2021
- ◆ The cost of construction will be funded primarily by Federal grants (80%) and will cost approximately \$1,360,000 to construct.
